**Class 17 FIRST RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

**Class 18 LEAD REIN PLAITED AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Lead Rein Pony mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday but not their 9<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

**Class 19. FIRST RIDDEN PLAITED AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 10<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

**Class 20** Best pony not to exc 14.2hh rider any age but must be the correct size for the pony.

**Class 21. PLAITED PONY AMATEUR OF THE YEAR (TSR)**

Open plaited pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 153cms. Any suitably mounted rider. Spurs must not be worn

**Class 22.** Small breeds Mountain & Moorland registered or unregistered, rider any age but must be the correct size for the pony.

**Class 23. COLOURED PONY AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn. Ponies under 153 cms. This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final

**Class 24. MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND SMALL BREEDS RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and Welsh B. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year and suitably mounted. Spurs must not be worn.

*Championship for 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> prize winners in classes 14-24 (2)*

**Class 25.** Ridden veteran aged 15 or over

**Class 29** Novice horse/pony class. Horse/Pony not to have won a 1<sup>st</sup> rosette prior to today in a showing class. Rider any age .Including lead reins

**Class 30.** Large breeds Mountain & Moorland ,rider any age.

**Class 31.** Best Mare /Gelding or stallion any height rider any age but must be the correct size for the horse or pony

**Class 32. COLOURED HORSE AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Animals 153cms and over This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final.

**Class 33. MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND LARGE BREEDS RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Fells, Dales, Highlands, New Forests, Connemara, Welsh C and Welsh D. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn

#### **Class 38 .RIDDEN COB AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)**

Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. . Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show Spurs may be worn by adult riders

**Class 39.RIDDEN HUNTER AMATEUR OF THE YEAR(TSR)** Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. . Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show Spurs may be worn by adult riders

#### **Class 40**

#### **Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2027**

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an **Amateur**. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

#### **The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2027**

**Prizes** – RoR rosettes 1<sup>st</sup>–4<sup>th</sup> + RoR Tattersalls official merchandise voucher 1<sup>st</sup> £20, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

*The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Special at the Jockey Club*

*RoR National Championships on **August 22<sup>nd</sup> 2026**. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the*

*RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same date – **August 22<sup>nd</sup> 2026**. Amateur definition:*

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

## **Class 41**

### **Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026**

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered** horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st of January 2026.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused by racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10

## ***No dogs are allowed on the show ground***

### **RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- 1. Correct British Standard Headgear up to the latest standard must be worn at all times when mounted with a three point harness.. Handlers under 14 years must wear correctly secured BSI Skull cap/Riding hats.*
- 2. The judges decision is final .*
- 3. To enter this show you need not be a member, but qualification will only be given to those who fulfil the relevant criteria as per the society rules for the regional finals where appropriate.*
- 4. Entry fees are not refundable .*
- 5. There are strictly no dogs allowed on the show ground except for assisted dogs*
- 6. It is strongly recommended that all exhibitors carry adequate Public Liability Insurance. Sunnybank EC its employees or assistants do not accept any liability for any injury or damage sustained by any third party whether to horse/rider spectator or property whatsoever and how so ever caused.*
- 7. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry without any reason being given and if necessary to alter or cancel any class at anytime.*
- 8. Any vehicles parked do so at their own risk.*
- 9. Spurs/Dress spurs may not be worn in any show hunter pony/intermediate show hunter or any ridden Mountain& Moorland class. Competition Horse/Pony, Riding Horse and competitors in Sports horse classes may wear spurs.*
- 10. Any pony stallion not exceeding 138cms Or Small breeds M&M stallion may not be ridden by juniors who have not attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year. Stallions exceeding 138cms or Large Breed M&M may not be ridden by juniors who have not attained their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.*
- 11. Show canes whips are not allowed to exceed 30" (75cms). In lead rein classes plain or leather covered canes only maybe used. Spurs may not be worn in Riding pony, WHP,SHP or Mountain & Moorland classes.*

12. *Any objections must be received in writing within 10 minutes of the conclusion of the class together with a deposit of £30 which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.*
13. *No working in or cantering is allowed in the lorry park.*
14. *No dung or bedding is to be left in the car park. Anyone found skipping out lorries/trailers in the car park, or putting it in the bins will be fined and banned.*
15. *Only food and drink purchased at Sunnybank ec can be taken into the indoor arena*
16. *No horse manure hay etc to be put in the bins provided. They are for litter only.*
17. *In the event of the show having to be cancelled prior to the day 50% of all entry fees will be retained for administration. In the unfortunate event of the show having to be abandoned on the day, no entry fees will be refunded.*
18. *We have no facilities for you to lunge your horses/ponies. Lungeing is forbidden at all indoor shows in the manege or indoor arena.*
19. All horses/ponies competing at Sunnybank must have up to date Vaccinations. All passports must accompany the horse and maybe checked for validation.
- 20. Anyone found bringing a horse or pony to Sunnybank which has knowingly been in contact with any infectious or contagious diseases or have known diseases will be asked to leave and banned for life.**

Sunnybank EC it's employees officials stewards or anyone volunteering shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage or loss or for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to Exhibitors, Competitors, or members of the General Public or their Servants, Agents or to anyone on the Showground, or for any loss, claim, matter circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of nor attributable or any journey to or from the Show.

- No individual for which he/she is responsible as owner lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.

- The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry; cancel or alter classes or postpone the event due to unforeseen circumstances. The organisers also reserve the right, if necessary, to amend the schedule, which may mean that riders compete in less classes than advertised. In the unlikely event that the event is cancelled and a new date cannot be found , the Organisers will return everyone's monies, less an administration charge of up to 50% of the total price, to cover the irrecoverable costs of preparing to host the event.

Whilst at our events DO NOT-

1. DO NOT Let your horse graze
2. DO NOT Let them touch any other horses or stand too close to other horses
3. DO NOT Leave them tied to the trailer or lorry
4. DO NOT Let strangers touch your horses.
5. DO NOT Let them eat a haynet outside the lorry or trailer
6. DO NOT go anywhere other than permitted areas.
7. DO NOT Hang around the arena or collecting rings once you have competed.

All of the above must be complied with and are a condition of entering our events. It is up to each and everyone of you to be vigilant, stay away from other horses- do not share water and take responsibility for keeping your horses safe.
